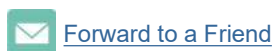
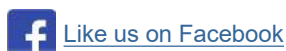

Mural Routes organized the Live Art Festival as part of the Pan Am Path Art Relay. The festival was created with the support of partners StreetARToronto, City of Toronto Parks, and the local Corktown CRBA. In addition to a lively community festival on June 20th, 18 underpass pillars were painted by graffiti and mural artists, and 5 road-facing pillars were painted as a mega mural project by artists Troy Lovegates and Labrona as a StreetART Underpass Project.

set to be complete by July 20th.

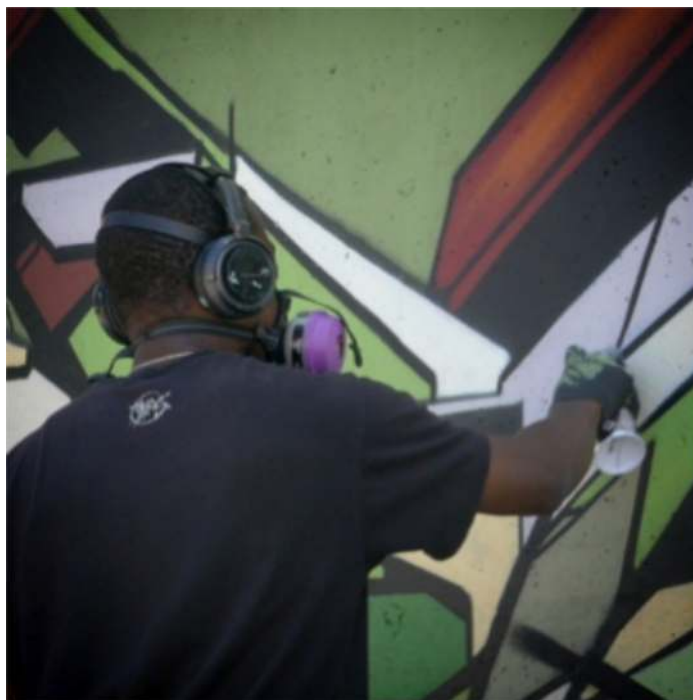
